

#### **BACKGROUND & PURPOSE**

At the age of 24 on 6th April 2013, Sarah's short but remarkably well-lived life was brought to an abrupt and brutal end, when she was mercilessly stabbed to death on a houseboat on Dal Lake, Kashmir.

The events of that night currently remain a mystery, although Sarah's parents' determination to secure Justice for Sarah is relentless.

Everyone who knew Sarah - and very many others - were stunned and saddened to learn of the Tragedy. They continue their endeavours to keep the memory of Sarah alive in the hope that she will never be forgotten.

The Sarah Groves Foundation was formed at the end of 2013 to do just that. The keywords Children, Art, Fitness and Adventure accurately define her passions in life.

On the fundraising side, we differentiate ourselves from other charitable trusts insofar as many activities provide once-in-a-lifetime, never-to-be-repeated opportunities to our fundraisers.

On the distribution side, funds are donated in line with our Mission Statement to 'Enhance Young Lives'. The Trustees endeavour to strike a balance between short-term support that is 'here today and gone tomorrow' with longer-term capital-based projects that stand the test of time.

The Sarah Groves Foundation is officially registered in Guernsey as charity number CH445 and we are Member Number 387 of the Association of Guernsey Charities.

In 2018 we:

Raised just over £250,000 Increased our reserves by almost £40,000 Distributed almost £100,000





#### **FUNDRAISING**

Total funds raised in 2018 amounted to £250,000.

Fundraising was dominated by the third Tour de Sez cycle ride, on this occasion from St Malo to Amsterdam, a cycling distance of more than 750 miles. The tour was sponsored by First Central Group and raised more than £150,000 net of all costs.

This was a highly demanding fundraising project that stretched organisers and riders to the limit over the entire 18 months of planning, training and implementation. It comprised 85 riders and 15 support staff in 9 vehicles over ten glorious days in September. The Tour went through France, Belgium, Netherlands, Germany and back into the Netherlands before ending up in Dam Square, Amsterdam on 14<sup>th</sup> September 2018, often covering a cycling distance of more than 100 miles in a day. Thankfully, everyone returned safely to Guernsey on Sunday 16<sup>th</sup> September thanks to Condor Ferries who kindly amended their schedules from St Malo without which we would have been unable to return that day.

Our sincere thanks go to everyone associated with this memorable tour - your contribution, financial or otherwise, is hugely appreciated.

In September, Fred O'Nillon nominated the Sarah Groves Foundation as his charity of choice when he undertook the Great Glen Challenge through the Caledonian Canal connecting Loch Lochy, Loch Oich, Loch Ness and on to Inverness. The official definition of Fred's sport is Stand Up Paddle Racing and his sterling efforts in difficult conditions raised almost £800 for the Foundation and our thanks go out to him and to all his sponsors.

#### **DISTRIBUTION OF FUNDS**

Total distributions in 2018 amounted to £95,299.34.

As a grant-giving charity, the recipients of distributed funds are invariably organisations or charities, which means that we do not make donations to individuals.

Our philosophy is to distribute funds raised in Guernsey back into Guernsey. However, funds raised elsewhere may be distributed elsewhere. In 2018 we raised approximately £75,000 from outside of Guernsey, a much higher figure than usual, attributable almost totally to the Tour de Sez. Nonetheless, the vast majority of distributions directly benefitted Guernsey.

Our close relationship with Home-Start Guernsey continued with donations totalling £18,000 in support of three parent and toddler drop-in centres. These have been very successful within their local communities of St Peter Port, St Martin's and the Vale, this latter one being dedicated to 'father and toddler'. In the last quarter of 2018, a fourth drop-in centre was started in St Pierre du Bois. Our commitment to Home-Start Guernsey runs until July 2019.



In July, we partnered with Floral Guernsey in staging the third Magical Days in the Park with an investment of £10,000. This wonderful three-day event in Saumarez Park in the height of summer and held in idyllic conditions enables more than 1,800 children of primary school age from Guernsey, Alderney, Sark and Herm to spend half a day learning about the outdoor way of life.





Themed groups covered a variety of tasks including Bushcraft Skills (pictured above); Wonderful Willow; Forest Skills; Stick Boats; Homes for Nature; Miniature Gardens; History of the Park; Camouflage in Nature; Nature's Recyclers and for the younger children the Apothecary, Flopsies, Hoppities and Peter Rabbit in the Victorian Walled Kitchen Gardens courtesy of the Guernsey Botanical Trust.

Sundry other distributions included £3,143 to Le Murier School in support of a group of teenagers with special educational needs undertaking their Duke of Edinburgh Bronze Award Scheme; £1,710 to the Town Centre Partnership for children's activities in the annual St Peter Port Carnival; £3,000 in support of David Ummels / Art for Guernsey as a contribution towards a major art exhibition.

'ChoraChori' is the Nepali word for 'children'. It is also the name of a UK-based charity that confronts violence against children in Nepal, including child rape, trauma management and bringing rapists to justice. Its record of success is remarkable and when contacted by Chora Chori in 2015 the Trustees of the Sarah Groves Foundation were unanimous in their support and a donation of £5,000 was made.

December started with the opening of the brand new and exciting Guille Allès Children's Library in St Peter Port. We were the major sponsor for this £130,000 project with a donation of £50,000. The official opening was a highly emotional evening carried live of local television. The Harry Potter themed library comprises two rooms, the main entrance to which is adorned by artwork drawn by Sarah and the main room itself is named '*The Sarah Groves Room*'. We are very proud of this investment, which is a highly fitting legacy in Sarah's memory. It will enhance many young lives for years to come.







### **OTHER HIGHLIGHTS OF 2018**

In 2017, we received confirmation that two species of plant would be officially launched in 2018 bearing the name *Sarah Elizabeth*.

The first is a clematis, officially unveiled at the Chelsea Flower Show in May. Our sincere thanks go to Raymond Evison, the world-renowned expert in clematis, for making this possible.

The second is a rose, which was officially unveiled at the Hampton Court Flower Show in July. For this, we must thank our very good friends Geoff and Jenny Dorey and the Blue Diamond Group, part of which is Fryers Roses based in Knutsford, Cheshire. Knutsford is where we all lived before moving to Guernsey in 1996, thereby providing a meaningful connection with Sarah.

Other highlights of 2018 included the creative fundraising initiatives adopted by participants in the *Tour de Sez 2018*. The stand-out endeavour was by Graham Glass who designed and built Boaty McBike Face. In 2017 he was the first person to 'cycle' from Guernsey to Herm – a distance of approximately 3 miles. In 2018 be went one stage further by 'cycling' from Guernsey to Sark – twice the distance and much more dangerous. Graham's endeavours raised over £10,000 for the *Tour de Sez 2018*. Well done Graham and sincere thanks – such a pity you have moved to France.
